His most ambitious project has been reclaiming the birthplace of Greenville, the historic Reedy River Falls, and the creation of a world-class public garden along the river. Mayor White is a partner in the law firm of Haynsworth, Sinkler & Boyd, where he heads the Firm's immigration and customs practices.

A native of Greenville, Mayor White graduated from Christ Church Episcopal School, Greenville Senior High School, Wake Forest University, and the University of South Carolina School of Law. Mayor White is married to Marsha P. White and they have two children. He is a member of Christ Church Episcopal, North Greenville Rotary, Board of Visitors of the University Center of Greenville, and serves on the Boards of The Peace Center for the Performing Arts and the Commission of Public Works.
